6. Stallion Grazing, Futurity and Bloodlines	The new grazing at Mottisfont is nearly ready to move to and a draft agreement has been received from the National Trust. This agreement will be on a five year farm assured tenancy at a cost of £7,600 per annum. There is enough room at Mottisfont to facilitate the Stallions and the Futurity Colts. The current agreement with Cadland is due to expire at the end of March – The committee agreed that it would be beneficial and withing the allocated project budgets to retain Cadland for either the Futurity Colts or a new Bloodline Scheme. TW paid 3 stallion owners £95.94 each as a contribution as they are not members of the Verderers Grazing Scheme.	
7. Sponsorship of Cattle Classes	The Committee considered if sponsoring cattle classes at the Annual Breed Show could be a way of incentivising forest type cattle – the committee felt this was not appropriate at this time due to the very small numbers entering these classes.	
8. 2024 VGS Annual Grants	The Committee studied the 2024 budgets for the VGS Annual Grants and approved the projected costs. The new compensation for death on the Forest (Fallen Stock) support for assistance towards disposal costs has been adopted well with 16 claims so far since last Autumn. The Committee discussed raising the amount of assistance but it was decided to leave at the current rate whilst it becomes more publicised and review next year. TW raised the need to include the victims of Hit and Run fatalities in this scheme as currently they do not receive the assistance. The Committee agreed that Hit and Run casualties could claim the £100 but would need to reimburse if a driver came forward subsequently. TW to write this into the application form conditions. The other change to the VGS implemented in 2023 was to encourage pig owners to turn out for Pannage by increasing the standard 0.3 LU for pigs to 0.6 LU for the 1st 20 pigs marked and 0.3 LU for any additional pigs marked. This saw the number of commoners turning out pigs increase to 35.	Action TW
9. VGS Rule Violations 2023-24	When the Verderers Grazing Scheme payments were made at the end of December 2 holdings had their payments held pending further investigation into VGS rule violations. 15/187/0060 Arters Lawn – holding a total of £7675.20 The committee heard that following the withholding of the 2022 cattle supplement due to failure to remove stock as requested the commoner has continued to be in breach of VGS rules 1.3 – 1.6 – 1.8 – 1.9 – 1.10 – 5.1 – 6.1 – 6.2 – 6.3 – 6.4 – 11.4 by having stock at large on the Forest unmarked and not TB tested – reported as "lost at Forest" but very visibly there. Small calves left unaccompanied on forest whilst their mothers have been taken	

	in. Poor Animals requested by the Agister to be removed not removed and	
	poor welfare standards at his holding resulting in visits from Trading Standards and APHA vets – Decision to not pay 2023 Grazing payments or	
	the 2023 cattle supplement put on hold pending further investigations.	
	15/186/0102 Pondhead Farm – holding a total of £9555.62 The committee heard that following the withholding of the 2022 cattle supplement due to failing to remove poor cattle when requested. The committee were supplied with a letter from the commoner in regard to this rule violation – the decision was upheld. The commoners have now been in breach of the VGS rules 5.1- 11.14 The movement of 53 cattle to a high-risk TB area was not recorded and only after the location of these animals was reported to the Verderers was a movement record created two months later after APHA had been alerted to the violation. The consequence of these animals being returned to the Forest herd without either being pre movement tested or isolated for 60	
	days and retested would compromise the TB Status of the Forest herd. The committee voted to uphold the non- payment of the 2023 Grazing payments and the 2023 Cattle Supplement. TW to write to commoner with the decision.	Action TW
	RD to write to HCC and cc APHA, RPA and OV setting out the case and noting the disappointment that Trading Standards have not taken either of these cases further which would make our decision to withhold these payments as an obvious breach in the VGS terms and conditions.	Action RD
10. AOB	Reports from Agisters of a number of cattle belonging to one commoner likely to be remaining on the Forest after the end of the TB window (29th Feb). The Agisters will supply details of the animals left after the 1st March and the VGS Committee will discuss at June's meeting – TW to withhold paying the commoner their Cattle Supplement pending the committee's decision at the June meeting. TW to advise the Commoner	Action TW
